Saint Formation
Matthew 5:1 - 12

God—the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit—are working in the world to make Saints, people perfected in love, through the Church, Mass, Sacraments, a life of virtue, and prayer. Every day that is what the Triune God (*The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit comprise the one God*) is working to accomplish in you and me, and through us.

The Beatitudes of Matthew 5:1 - 12 describe Saints, people who are truly happy because they live the fully human lives God made humans to live. Saints know they completely depend upon God for everything, mourn over the world's brokenness and their own, bow humbly before God, hungering and thirsting for His justice in the world and bringing it about through corporal and spiritual works of mercy. Therefore, Saints have an undivided heart, all for God, and daily live God's mission of peace (shalom)-making, embracing suffering for the sake of shining forth God's infinite love and mercy for the healing of the world.

For that reason, Saints know and possess the true happiness of the Kingdom of Heaven (God's Reign of Love), comfort, the earth, satisfaction of justice, mercy, God, and adoption as children of God.

This concludes our meditation on the Beatitudes. The Triune God made you to be a Saint. Open yourself up to the fullness of His gifts and life and experience the Beatitude-life, true happiness, the life of a Saint.

Catechism Catechesis

... is present in the earthly liturgy ...
1088 "To accomplish so great a work" - the dispensation or communication of his work of salvation - "Christ is always present in his Church, especially in her liturgical celebrations. He is present in the Sacrifice of the Mass not only in the person of his minister, 'the same now offering, through the ministry of priests, who formerly offered himself on the cross,' but especially in the Eucharistic species. By his power he is present in the sacraments so that when anybody baptizes, it is really Christ himself who baptizes. He is present in his word since it is he himself who speaks when the holy Scriptures are read in the Church. Lastly, he is present when the Church prays and sings, for he has promised 'where two or three are gathered together in my name there am I in the midst of them.'"
1089 "Christ, indeed, always associates the Church with himself in this great work in which God is perfectly glorified and men are sanctified. The Church is his beloved Bride who calls to her Lord and through him offers worship to the eternal Father."
