**Israel's Story, Jesus' Story, (Y)Our Story**  
Formed by the Gospels  
**Matthew 1 - 28, Romans 1 - 8**  
(Genesis - Joshua)

**Israel's story**

God made a covenant with Abraham and his sons to undo the sin of Adam, an oath to restore humanity and creation, and He promised that He would deliver Israel from slavery/evil in Egypt (Gen. 1-50). He then delivered Israel from slavery/evil and led them through the Red Sea and wilderness to Mt. Sinai, where He renewed the covenant and gave Israel the Ten Commandments of Love. God then led Israel through the wilderness wandering and the conquest of Canaan (Exodus - Joshua).

**Jesus' story**

In St. Matthew's Gospel, Jesus is directly linked to Abraham and Israel through his genealogy, Exodus from Egypt and Baptism, temptation in the wilderness, New Mt. Sinai intensification of the Ten Commandments, and conquest of "Canaan" with his healing love, forgiveness, and Passion, thereby delivering humanity from sin/selfishness and death for the New Heavens and Earth that is to come (chapters 1 - 28).


**(Y)Our story**

Beginning with Baptism, followed by the other sacraments, God promises to deliver humanity from slavery to sin/selfishness and death, and to lead us by His Spirit through the wilderness wandering of this life to the New Creation liberated from its bondage to decay (Romans 1 - 8). God's unbreakable promise became/becomes yours personally through Baptism and your life with the Spirit. In fact, earnest recitation of the Our Father and Mass with the reception of Jesus (the Lamb of God) in the Eucharist is your personal Exodus/deliverance from slavery to sin/selfishness and strengthening in the Spirit for your wandering through life. May the Holy Spirit awaken us to the magnitude and grandeur of this marvelous gift.
