**True Happiness - Intro
Formed by the Gospels
Matthew 5:1 - 12**

In my first reflection upon the Gospels a few weeks ago we observed that all four of them, right from the beginning, announce about Jesus, "Here is your God!" Last week we considered that Israel's story is Jesus' story is our/your communal and personal story; a story of New Exodus/deliverance from slavery to evil/sin/selfishness. Each reflection concluded by acknowledging that at every Mass the celebrant makes present and says of Jesus, "Here is your God!" and we are delivered more deeply from slavery to evil/sin/selfishness, if we want to be. This week we will begin to contemplate Jesus' teaching on true happiness.

A notable Jewish scholar once said, "The disturbing thing about Jesus is that he inserts himself where only God belongs." Nowhere is that more evident than in Jesus' famous Sermon on the Mount, the New Mount Sinai, in which He repeatedly says, "You have heard that it was said (by God), but I say to you ..." (my parentheses) In so saying, Jesus claimed that His teachings supersede God's! Of course, only God can supersede His own teachings, so we know Jesus was revealing Himself to be the God of Israel and of all Creation. Oh Jesus, you are so amazing!

The Sermon on the Mount begins with the Beatitudes. In Part Three, Section One, Chapter One, Article Two of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the Magisterium explains that all human beings long for happiness and that the Beatitudes of Jesus reveal the path to true happiness. In the Gospel of John, Jesus said, "I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy may be complete (15:11)." Wow! The God of all Creation is the happiest being in all Creation and He wants His joy to be in you, His perfect joy/happiness. I trust that you, like me, long for that level of joy and happiness. Next week we will begin to meditate upon Jesus' revelation of true happiness in the Beatitudes.
