**Formed by the Gospels**  
**“Blessed are the poor in spirit”**  
**Matthew 5:3**

As shared last week, Jesus embodies the Beatitudes and shows us the way to true happiness. Jesus first shows us what “Blessed are the poor in spirit” means during His temptation, when He said, “Man does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God (Matt. 4:3-4).” Jesus also reveals what “Blessed are the poor in spirit” means by what He taught. He said, “Amen, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven (Matt. 18:1-5).” Jesus’ point is, as children depend upon their parents for everything, and as Jesus depends upon His Father for everything, so those who know they depend entirely upon God for everything are poor in spirit and inherit the kingdom of heaven.

Is it true that you depend upon God for everything? Think about it. Did you create yourself? Do you make your brain work and your heart beat? Did you create the universe that provides you all you need to live? Did you invent the Mass and Sacraments that give you spiritual life? Yes, it’s true that we work and provide a lot for ourselves, because God desires us to cooperate with Him for our well-being and that of others. But, in the bigger picture, we would not have a universe and we would not even be alive if it weren’t for God. To be “poor in spirit”, to be truly happy, begins with realizing that we depend upon God for everything.

**Catechism Catechesis**

*What does the word liturgy mean?*  
1069 The word "liturgy" originally meant a "public work" or a "service in the name of/on behalf of the people." In Christian tradition it means the participation of the People of God in "the work of God."<sup>5</sup> Through the liturgy Christ, our redeemer and high priest, continues the work of our redemption in, with, and through his Church.  
1070 In the New Testament the word "liturgy" refers not only to the celebration of divine worship but also to the proclamation of the Gospel and to active charity.<sup>6</sup> In all of these situations it is a question of the service of God and neighbor.  
In a liturgical celebration the Church is servant in the image of her Lord, the one "leitourgos";<sup>7</sup> she shares in Christ's priesthood (worship), which is both prophetic (proclamation) and kingly (service of charity): The liturgy then is rightly seen as an exercise of the priestly office of Jesus Christ.  
It involves the presentation of man's sanctification under the guise of signs perceptible by the senses and its accomplishment in ways appropriate to each of these signs. In it full public worship is performed by the Mystical Body of Jesus Christ, that is, by the Head and his members. From this it follows that every liturgical celebration, because it is an action of Christ the priest and of his Body which is the Church, is a sacred action surpassing all others. No other action of the Church can equal its efficacy by the same title and to the same degree.
