**Formed by the Gospels:
"Blessed are they who mourn"
Matthew 5:4**

If the Church teaches that the Beatitudes reveal the way to true happiness, then why is the second Beatitude, "Blessed are they who mourn"? How can a mourning person be truly happy?
 A person cannot be perfectly happy while people in the world suffer from severed relationships with God, one another, self, and creation. Jesus, who embodies the Beatitudes as the happiest human being on earth and in heaven, mourns over the brokenness of humanity and death (Matthew 23:37, Luke 22:39-46, John 11:32-36, just a few examples). Even for Jesus, complete happiness must wait for the putting right of humanity and creation at the Final Judgment.
 Unlike Jesus, we have more to mourn about before God comforts and infuses us with true happiness—personal sin-selfishness. As long as even the smallest amount of selfishness remains in us, we can never be truly happy, because what happens when our selfishness cannot be satisfied? We are unhappy. We must mourn, repent of, confess, and be purged of every ounce of selfishness in us before we can be truly happy. The more we experience deliverance from self-centeredness, the happier we become. That is why the Mass, and especially the Eucharist—Jesus, is so important. Jesus in the Eucharist is the most powerful means we have on earth to be delivered from the selfishness that keeps us from true happiness.
 As with being poor in spirit, so mourning is part of the process toward attaining true happiness. True happiness is impossible without poverty of spirit and mourning.

Catechism Catechesis

Liturgy as source of life
 1071 As the work of Christ liturgy is also an action of his Church. It makes the Church present and manifests her as the visible sign of the communion in Christ between God and men. It engages the faithful in the new life of the community and involves the "conscious, active, and fruitful participation" of everyone.
 1072 "The sacred liturgy does not exhaust the entire activity of the Church": it must be preceded by evangelization, faith, and conversion. It can then produce its fruits in the lives of the faithful: new life in the Spirit, involvement in the mission of the Church, and service to her unity.
