SAINT FORMATION Matthew 5:43 - 48

I am writing this on Friday, January 18, 2019. The Gospel reading for today is the account of a paralytic's friends bringing him to Jesus for healing (Mark 2:1 - 12). In his remarks about the reading, Fr. Shiju noted that paralysis afflicts many people mentally, emotionally, and spiritually, too. People become enemies because of such paralysis manifesting itself in harmful behaviors, such as: mean-spirited glances, gossip and partial truth-telling, slander, grudges, revenge, and more and worse.

In Matthew 5:43 - 48, Jesus commands, "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." As the paralytic's friends brought him to Jesus for healing, so we befriend enemies by bringing them to Jesus in prayer, trusting him to heal them deep within, delivering them from slavery to dislike and hate. As we do so, the Holy Spirit molds and shapes us into Saints perfected in love, just like our heavenly Father.

I feel prompted to remind us that we may be someone's enemies, which brings to mind some sage advice I read recently, "We must make it easier for people to love us." What can we do this week to make it easier for our enemies to love us? For starters, we can do no better than participating in Mass and receiving the sacraments with a humble attitude, then intentionally try to live lives of virtue and prayer.
