The pain of abortion – from one who knows...

“When I found out I was pregnant, I was so scared and felt like I didn’t know where to turn. I felt like I had no other choice. After I had my abortion I felt relief at first. But after 7 years of denial it finally hit me. I was so scared when I found out what an abortion really [is]. I was so angry at my family and boyfriend (now husband). I felt like nobody was there for me. I was angry at the clinic personnel for saying everything would be fine. I found Project Rachel and they helped me start to grieve [for] my child. So many women feel that if they had more support and truth during their crisis pregnancy many lives would have been saved.”

True happiness, according to Jesus, is the Beatitude-life, the life of a Saint. In Matthew 5: 13 – 20, Jesus declares, first of all, that people living the Beatitude-life stand out in culture like salt in food and light in darkness, thereby transforming people of the world into citizens of the Kingdom who glorify our heavenly Father. Secondly, Jesus makes clear that people living the Beatitude-life obey and teach the commandments, God’s Law of Love, which he expounds more fully in the rest of Matthew chapters 5 – 7.

PLEASE NOTE: You and I will only enjoy the Kingdom of Heaven, the New Heavens and Earth, forever, if we live the Beatitude-life, the life of a Saint, the life of obeying and teaching God’s Law of Love. PERFECT LOVE is the goal, because only people who perfectly love God and one another, even enemies, will enter the Kingdom of Heaven.

I know this sounds daunting, even impossible. But, remember, with God all things are possible. The Great News (the Gospel) is that God—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit—gives us His love through the Paschal Mystery of the Mass and Sacraments in order to transform us so that we love the way we’re made to love. The gift of God’s love combined with daily trying to practice Jesus’s teachings will form us into the people God made us to be, Beatitude-people, Saints, and truly happy. When we intentionally live that way, we will also be God’s missionaries in our culture, standing out life salt in food and light in darkness for the healing of humanity.
