Formed by the Gospels

Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for justice
Matthew 5:6

As noted previously, Jesus delivered the Beatitudes in an ascending order, though, after we ascend through them, we may experience them simultaneously. Let us follow the progression. Illumined by the Holy Spirit, we first come to acknowledge complete dependence upon God for life, breath, and everything we have; that is being poor in spirit. Next, the Holy Spirit makes us more aware of the world's and personal brokenness, which causes Jesus-like mourning in us. That leads in turn to meekness or humility, recognizing that true happiness comes with aligning ourselves with God's will rather than insisting upon our will. Having come to the realization that God's will being done is better than ours being done, the Holy Spirit then creates and increases in us a hunger and thirst, a yearning, for God's justice/righteousness to be accomplished in our personal lives and in the world. Further exploration of what God's justice looks like must wait until next week. For now, let us meditate upon and absorb the connection between the first four Beatitudes and true happiness. The stark reality is that none of us can be TRULY and PERFECTLY happy until God's justice is satisfied in us and in the world. The questions that lead us to the next Beatitude are what is God's justice and how is it satisfied?

Catechism Catechesis

1076 The Church was made manifest to the world on the day of Pentecost by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. The gift of the Spirit ushers in a new era in the "dispensation of the mystery" the age of the Church, during which Christ manifests, makes present, and communicates his work of salvation through the liturgy of his Church, "until he comes." In this age of the Church Christ now lives and acts in and with his Church, in a new way appropriate to this new age. He acts through the sacraments in what the common Tradition of the East and the West calls "the sacramental economy"; this is the communication (or "dispensation") of the fruits of Christ's Paschal mystery in the celebration of the Church's "sacramental" liturgy.
