Thirty Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, November 10-11, 2018

**Formed by the Gospels
Blessed are the peacemakers
Matthew 5:9**

Having ascended through the first six Beatitudes, becoming people after God's own heart, we're now prepared to enter more fully into God's mission, and perfect happiness. God's mission for us is to be peacemakers, like Jesus.

To be a peacemaker in Jesus's day was to be a "shalom"-maker. Shalom is the Hebrew word for peace and means much more than having a peaceful, easy feeling. To Jesus and the Jews of his day shalom meant, and still means, complete restoration of the human person, or wholeness. People experience shalom/peace as they receive corporal and spiritual works of mercy in their lives.

Think about it. In God's eyes, it is unjust for people to be hungry, thirsty, naked, homeless, isolated in sickness and prison, buried in an undignified manner, ignorant of His love and purpose for humanity, despairing, and unforgiven when repentant. Justice is satisfied when people experience the shalom/peace brought about through the corporal and spiritual works of mercy.

The first six Beatitudes prepare us for the mission of being peacemakers, like Jesus, at home and in our parish, community, and world. That is what God made us for, and that is what will bring us perfect happiness.

Catechism Catechesis

II. Christ's Work in the Liturgy

Christ glorified . . .

1084 "Seated at the right hand of the Father" and pouring out the Holy Spirit on his Body which is the Church, Christ now acts through the sacraments he instituted to communicate his grace. The sacraments are perceptible signs (words and actions) accessible to our human nature. By the action of Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit they make present efficaciously the grace that they signify.

1085 In the liturgy of the Church, it is principally his own Paschal mystery that Christ signifies and makes present. During his earthly life Jesus announced his Paschal mystery by his teaching and anticipated it by his actions. When his Hour comes, he lives out the unique event of history which does not pass away: Jesus dies, is buried, rises from the dead, and is seated at the right hand of the Father "once for all." His Paschal mystery is a real event that occurred in our history, but it is unique: all other historical events happen once, and then they pass away, swallowed up in the past. The Paschal mystery of Christ, by contrast, cannot remain only in the past, because by his death he destroyed death, and all that Christ is - all that he did and suffered for all men - participates in the divine eternity, and so transcends all times while being made present in them all. The event of the Cross and Resurrection abides and draws everything toward life.
