## Breaking News

### Mt. Calvary Catholic Cemetery Potter's Field Internment

From Friday, April 30th thru Sunday May 2nd, the Knights of Columbus Mt. McLaughlin Council 2255 of Klamath Falls will be hosting the Knights of Columbus Oregon Council 113th State Convention at Sacred Heart Catholic Church. This year's Convention's theme is 'Mercy in Motion'. This comes from the fact that Knights are continuously performing Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy that extends God's compassion and mercy to those in need. At every convention, a community service project is undertaken. This year that project will focus on the Corporal Work of Mercy, to Bury the Dead. At Noon on Sunday, May 2nd the Convention will conclude with the interment of 143+ sets of abandoned or unclaimed cremains in the Mt. Calvary Catholic Cemetery Potter's Field. Knights from throughout the state of Oregon will assist with the interment. Bishop Liam Cary will preside over the Rite of Christian Burial for these cremains. Being that 7 of the cremains are of United States Military Veterans, Military Honors will be rendered. *Everyone is invited to join us for this moving Corporal Work of Mercy.*

Next Friday, April 30-Sunday May 2, the Knights of Columbus Mt. McLaughlin Council 2255 of Klamath Falls will host the Knights of Columbus Oregon Council 113th State Convention at Sacred Heart.

On Saturday evening, approximately 200 Knights and wives will be attending the 5:00 pm Mass here at St. Pius X. Bishop Liam Cary will be the main celebrant for the Necrology Mass and 5 additional priests will concelebrate, including Archbishop Alexander Sample. Please be advised of the additional people who will be attending the 5:00 pm Mass.

On Sunday May 2nd starting at Noon the Convention will conclude with an interment of 143+ sets of abandoned or unclaimed cremains in the Mt. Calvary Catholic Cemetery, Potter's Field. Dedicated in 2017, the Potter's Field provides the opportunity to extend the Catholic Church Corporal work of Mercy to 'Bury the Dead' by providing a final resting place for abandoned and unclaimed cremains. The theme for the 2021 Knights Convention is "Mercy in Motion". Knights throughout the state of Oregon have been and will be assisting with the interment. Bishop Cary will preside over the Rite of Christian Burial for these cremains.

## Parts of the Mass: Processions with Chants From the General Instruction of the Roman Missal

44. Among gestures are included also actions and processions, by which the Priest, with the Deacon and ministers, goes to the altar; the Deacon carries the Evangeliary or Book of the Gospels to the ambo before the proclamation of the Gospel; the faithful bring up the gifts and come forward to receive Communion. It is appropriate that actions and processions of this sort be carried out with decorum while the chants proper to them are sung, in accordance with the norms laid down for each.
