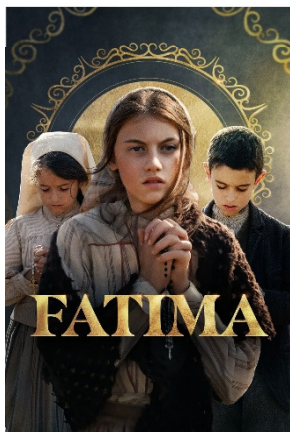

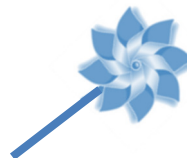
Bishop’s Annual Appeal 2021
