Rosary Catechism Conversation

Wednesday, April 7th at 9:15 AM in the Parish Hall, we will resume our Rosary Catechism Conversation by meditating upon and contemplating the First Glorious Mystery, the Resurrection of Our LORD, and by continuing our conversation about the Church's teaching on the after-life. We hope you will join us!

Why Does Jesus' Resurrection Matter?

With the help of His heavenly Father, the Holy Spirit, His Divine nature, and His human parents, family, friends, and enemies, Jesus perfected love, and all the other virtues, in His human nature. Jesus did that for love of you, and all people. Jesus revealed what that perfect love looks like during Holy Week; especially during His agony in the Garden, scourging at the pillar, crowning with thorns, carrying of the Cross, and crucifixion—most especially in His words, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." Then Jesus was buried, descended to the place of the dead in His soul, and then... RETURNED FROM DEATH in His resurrected body! He then ascended on high and with the heavenly Father sent the Holy Spirit with His perfect divine and human nature into the world at Pentecost, and into people's souls when they are baptized, confirmed, receive Him in the Eucharist, and through the rest of the sacraments. The Most Holy Trinity has done this to transform human nature in every person who wants to be transformed, so that we can love God, self, one another, and live in harmony with nature the way God made us to; so that we may all be one as Jesus, the Father, and the Spirit are one (John 17:20-23). Why does Jesus' resurrection matter? Because of Jesus' resurrection we know death and separation does not have the final word, LOVE and ONENESS does! Because of Jesus' resurrection, the Spirit is sent into the world with perfect divine and human love for all people, so that we may love and be one, as God the Trinity loves and is one. JESUS IS RISEN, ALLELUIA!
