The reason the co-op came about is because we wanted a catholic education for our children. That desire to have our faith central to our children's education translates through the entire co-op. The group uses a catholic science and history curriculum and we follow the liturgical calendar. Fr. Steve of Sacred Heart teaches religion every other week. On Tuesdays we begin mass at Sacred Heart with the Rosary and on Wednesdays we begin with morning mass and the children are lectors and servers.
