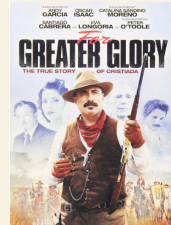

## Baptized Disciples for What?

Last week, we recalled that baptized disciples of Jesus Christ are people who have been born from above through water and Spirit; receiving a new heart and spirit and receiving the Spirit of God within them (Ezekiel 36:25-27, John 3:5, Acts 2:38). But, what have disciples of Jesus been made new on the inside for? Recall the closing purpose statement in Ezekiel 36:27, "...so that you walk in my statutes, observe my ordinances, and keep them." This sounds a lot like Jesus' words in the Great Commission, "Make disciples of all nations; baptizing them...teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you (Matthew 28:18-19)." We have been made disciples of Jesus Christ through baptism, so that we can observe all that Jesus commanded us, that is, to love God and neighbor the way the Holy Trinity made us to. And, according to Jesus, as we lovingly observe His commandments of love, conforming our lives to His, then we stand out like salt and shine like light to attract others to become disciples of Jesus through our good deeds (Matthew 5:13-20). So, what are these commandments of Jesus that make us stand out like salt and shine like light—like salty light bulbs—when we observe them? We will take up that topic next week and in weeks to come.
