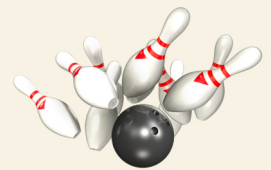

Please support the Catholic Daughters Bake Sale next weekend. All proceeds go toward high school and higher education scholarships.

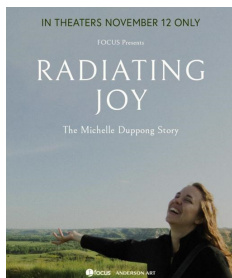
Christmas Boxes

Making Disciples through Love Sunday, November 10th

Making Disciples through Love Sunday, November 10th at 10:30 AM in the Parish Hall we will host our third Discipleship Forum of the year. Our Lord Jesus said that we make disciples by teaching baptized persons to observe all that He has commanded us. This begs the question: What has Jesus commanded us? To answer this question, we must look to the Church's teaching on the New Covenant and the Ten Commandments. Many people in the Church think they know the Ten Commandments, but surprisingly few can actually recite all ten in order, let alone specifically explain what the commandments actually consist of. Considering the Church's consequential teaching on erroneous (errors in) judgment and the necessity of observing the commandments for making disciples, we must all make sure that we not only can list the Ten Commandments, but also be able to explain what they consist of. In this forum, we will contemplate what the New Covenant means for us and we will cover the first three commandments; all toward the end of loving God and neighbor (including enemies) to make disciples for Jesus. In subsequent forums, we will cover the rest of the commandments.

The Michelle Duppong Story is the story of Servant of God

Michelle Duppong,

who bore witness to Christ through heroic suffering and a passion for inviting others to be transformed by His love. The film, directed by Danny Anderson, tells the story of Michelle's beautiful and faith-filled life, especially during her diagnosis, treatment, and death. In June 2022, Bishop David Kagan of Bismarck, North Dakota, announced the opening of the diocesan phase of investigation into Michelle's life, which could lead to her beatification and canonization. On December 25, 2015, Duppong died of cancer at the age of 31. The Michelle Duppong Guild and FOCUS, where Michelle served for 6 years, are honored to make known to the world the importance of Michelle's inspiring and heartening story.
