Saint Francis de Sales CATHEDRAL CONSERVATION COLLECTION

Have you been to St. Francis de Sales Cathedral in Baker City?

If you have, then you know how beautiful this historic church is and how blessed we are to call it our Mother Church. If you have not been there – the Cathedral, built in 1906, is located in Baker City. Although parishioners and visitors from afar have enjoyed its quiet grace for over 100 years, it was the local parishioners who have watched over its welfare.

In 2024, the front steps of the Cathedral were completely removed and replaced. This project was the largest improvement to date and a large balance due must be paid before any further repairs can be done. The Diocese is inviting us all to participate in the Cathedral Conservation Collection held once a year on or near January 24th, the Feast Day of St. Francis de Sales, our patron saint. The Cathedral Conservation Fund is managed by the Diocese and will be used for major repairs of the building only.

Some of the major repairs since 2019 this collection has already made possible are:

- (1) the boiler replacement,
- (2) the church ceiling remodel,
- (3) exterior stone repairs,
- (4) plumbing upgrades,
- (5) and the most recent was the replacement of the front steps to the church finished in 2024.

Routine maintenance of the church building will continue to be supported by the local parishioners. Please participate in this worthy collection.
